ESSENTIAL DUTIES, FUNCTIONS & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Reports to President and CEO concerning the operation, budget, compliance, performance and issues with the pipeline operations.
- Provide oversight of pipeline operation, which includes, but is not limited to preventative maintenance, quality and inventory control, performance optimization, instrumentation controls and calibration, safety programs and compliance, GIS system, pipeline monitoring, and emergency management.
- Collaborate with the development and implement strategic goals of the business unit.
- Implement a culture of excellence with respect to the Health, Safety and Security of Operations Staff and ensure all actions consider Environmental impacts with appropriate mitigation plans and ensure the safe, efficient, cost-effective operation of pipeline.
- Oversee personnel for growth and develop plans, performance standards and compliance for efficient operation and future growth of pipeline.
- Provide engineering guidance to operational personnel for pipeline issues as they arise.
- Manage, maintain and establish pipeline standards and procedures.
- Manage the budget, operations and personnel for RHP.
- Establish and maintain a positive image with outside agencies which include but are not limited to suppliers, customers, contractors, regulatory agencies and personnel, community members, partners, and public officials and tribal leaders.
- Perform effectively and cooperatively within the multidisciplinary groups of professionals, collaborate with the development and implement strategic goals.
- Develop relationships with various Navajo Nation governmental and other tribal agencies to ensure work effort progresses timely and effectively
- Ensure compliance with company policies, safety regulations on collaboration with regulatory agencies through working closely with HSE office.
- Maintain a competitive insight into policies changes, markets shift, competitor actions, and industry developments.
- Coordinate and maintain Spill Management criteria and compliance with Safety protocols.
- Provide training and mentoring, evaluation of internal staff, establish a staff development program to enhance Navajo human resources through internships, fellowship or entry level jobs
- Achieve goals and objectives through support and consideration of the Navajo culture, its agencies and government.
